## Patrol Challenge 3

### Use of Allocated Site

A well laid out site makes your camp easy to navigate, reduces accidents and improves your camping experience.

**Your camp should:**

- Not interfere with your next door neighbours
- Utilise minimal impact camping principles, e.g. do your best to leave no trace of your camp when you leave
- Walkways allow safe and free access within the site
- Site Boundaries are obvious, observed and do not create hazards
- Sleeping, kitchen/eating and cooking areas have been placed logically with respect to each other
- Camp layout makes efficient and safe use of the site
- Camp layout considers the prevailing winds
- Camp layout considers the lie of the land by considering where ground water will flow

#### The Challenge

1. Lay out a campsite on the following page using the scale provided and the size of sleeping tents that you have in your hall. Make sure you include the guy ropes. If you are not sure of the size, ask your Patrol leader or Scout leaders
2. Your site should include the items listed on the left and an entrance. Walk ways can be shown as dotted lines. You should also mark which way your tents open
3. Discuss the merits of your design with your Patrol and submit the best layout to your troop.
4. Your Troop Council will review and score your Patrol camp layout with a point for each correct item.

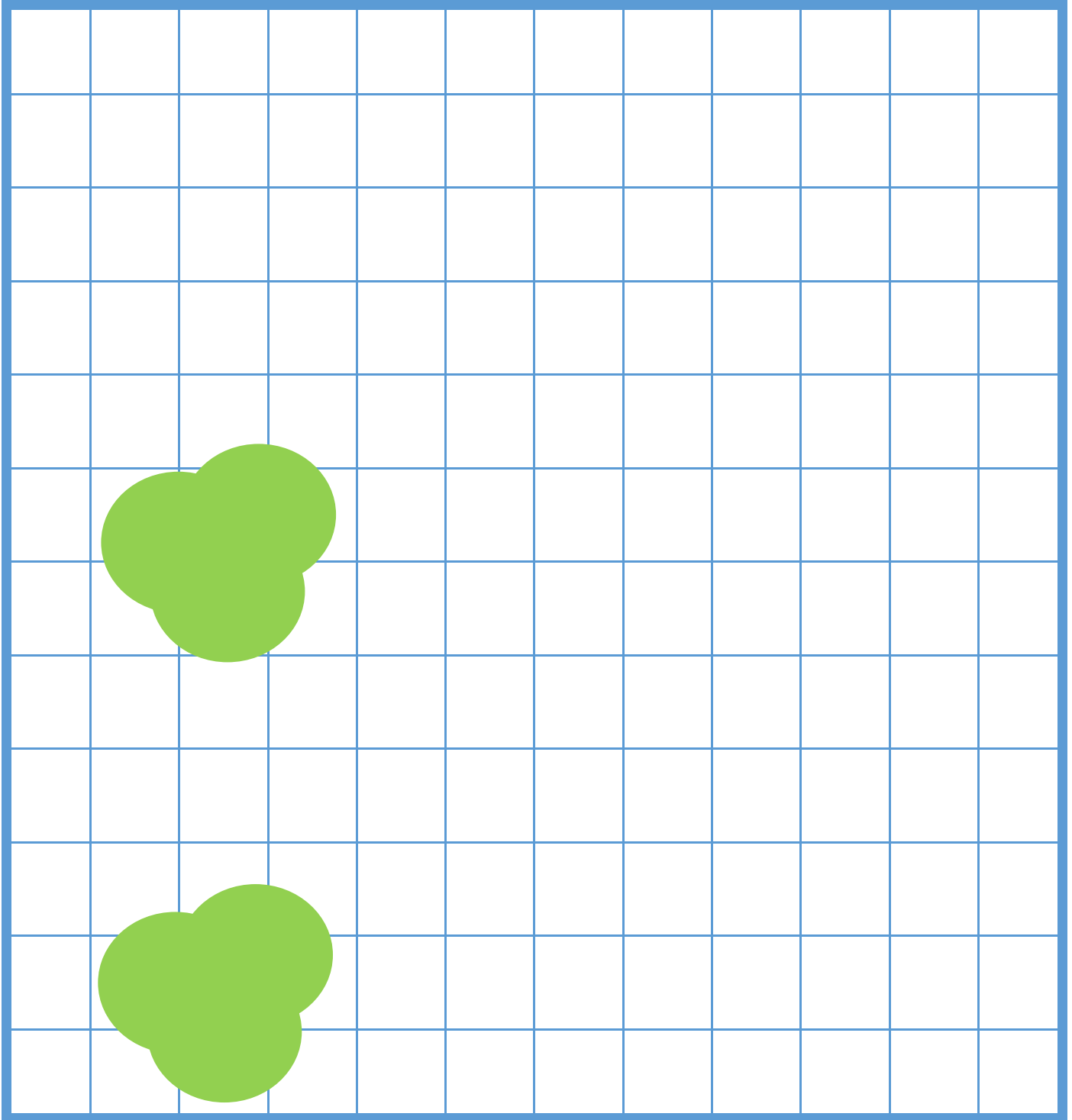
